
Havurah Sponsored Community Lunch A call for help......

Hamentaschen Recipes

From the kitchen of Mindy Betensky Licht

Traditional Recipe

¼ pound butter
1 cup sugar
3 eggs
1 t baking powder
½ t baking soda
1/8 t salt
4-4 ½ cups flour
1/3 cup orange juice
1 t vanilla

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.

Cream butter and sugar. Add eggs, one at a time. Add dry ingredients to butter, sugar and eggs, alternating with orange juice and vanilla. Roll out on floured board about ¼ inch thick. Cut into rounds and fill with fruit. Pinch edges together to form a triangle known as Hamen's hat. Grease cookie sheet. Bake for about 20 minutes. Do not overfill hamentaschen as they will break open while baking. Makes 30-ish hamentaschen.

"Quick and Easy" Recipe

1 box yellow cake mix
1 cup flour
2 large eggs, beaten
2T water (approximately)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F

Combine all of the above—if the dough is dry and crumbly, add water a few drops at a time. Start mixing with a fork, and finish with hands. Roll out on floured board about ¼ inch thick. Cut into rounds and fill with fruit. Pinch edges together to form a triangle known as Hamen's hat. Grease cookie sheet. Bake for about 20 minutes. Do not overfill hamentaschen as they will break open while baking. Makes 30-ish hamentaschen.
